- Still supportive of broad EIPP agenda




### Research, policy & practice drivers and funding arrangements influencing EIPP



- Greater need to demonstrate impact (e.g. REF and government outcome monitoring frameworks)
- More explicit, evidence-related registration and promotion criteria for professionals
- Deep public expenditure cuts



## Increased range of initiatives and resources to support EIPP



- More advocacy & practical guidance resources
- Better access to relevant evidence
- Wider range of books and articles covering different angles and subject areas
- UK still a leader?
























#### A lot has remained the same



- Many EIPP initiatives still centrally-driven (but not so directive?)
- Still focused on what works and RCTs (but some widening of questions and forms of relevant knowledge)



- Continuing emphasis on evidence push
- Continuance of sector & disciplinary silos
- Support for EIPP undermined by actions of key players and evidence rhetoric co-opted by vested interests
