Nature-Based Integration Project Resources Hub



Nature plays a valuable role in facilitating migrant integration in the UK. It offers both a site of engagement among migrants and non-migrants, and a space of connection in and of itself, with a range of benefits for individual and community-level wellbeing and belonging. To date, however, the affordances of nature-based integration have not been recognized in UK policy. Addressing this gap, the nature-based integration project draws together existing evidence from academic research, integration initiatives, and creative practice, with innovative new place-based research in urban, peri-urban, and rural integration sites across the UK, to produce policy and practice tools that support the realization of the natural environment as a resource for migrant integration. The project is delivered by an interdisciplinary, cross-sector team of academics, artists, local and national policymakers, and practitioners, and community members, utilizing a co-productive approach that ensures recognition of, and engagement with diverse positionalities and ways of knowing. It attends to the practical, affective, and embodied experiences of migrants and non-migrants within local environments via a 'deep mapping' approach that brings together participatory mapping, aesthetic workshops, and ethnographic methods to explore and communicate how nature influences multi-directional integration in local places.

The Resources Hub brings together a catalog of related publications, nature-based initiatives, films, festivals, and artworks. The database of publications, integration initiatives, and creative works related to nature-based integration constitutes an invaluable resource for academics, practitioners, and artists seeking to learn from existing work.

Publications

We conducted an extensive scoping review of existing scholarship to examine the extent, range, and nature of existing research in order to contextualize our study and inform the development of a draft conceptual framework. During our comprehensive scoping review of existing archives, we searched numerous sites, including, among others, Google Scholar, Web of Science, Scopus, relevant academic journals, and multiple peer-reviewed materials through university library archives. While searching these archives, we strategically used combinations of Boolean operators such as AND, OR, NOT, or AND NOT along with key nouns (e.g., natural environment, nature, forest, green space, park, garden, river, allotment, animals, and bees) and nature-based activities (e.g., walking, gardening, hiking, recreation, exercise, and birdwatching). These nature-related nouns and nature-based activities were used in conjunction with concepts such as community, neighborhoods, integration, belonging, migration, asylum, refugee integration, and naturalization. Through this process, we compiled the list of publications below.

Creative Works



It is widely recognized that integration is an affective, embodied experience, as well as a practical and sociocultural one. This is particularly critical for nature-based integration: an inherently sensorial, material, and often emotional relation. These aspects are rarely addressed in integration policy; however, strands of migration research have demonstrated the capacity of aesthetic exploration and representation to provide nuanced accounts of integration that both challenged and augmented dominant modes of understanding. Our Creative Works brought this knowledge to the fore by surveying contemporary visual arts and film created by UK-based, migrant-background artists that engaged with the natural environment. This survey covered visual arts and films exhibited/produced between 2011 and 2021 applying the following process: 1) Searched relevant exhibition and film catalogues and festival programmes, and academic publications to identify nature-engaged works. 2) Selected up to 45 works for inclusion, aiming to capture a range of art forms and engagements with the natural environment, with reference to spatial, temporal, sensory and affective dimensions. 3) Analyzed artworks using visual analysis to attend to artistic strategies of aesthetic representation (e.g., material, symbolic, metaphoric), and the identity/positionality of producers (e.g., visa category, ethnicity, life stage, gender).

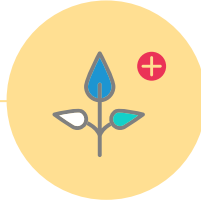

Nature-based Integration Initiatives



A significant barrier to understanding nature-based integration is the disconnect between research and practice. We conducted a survey of nature-based initiatives in the UK to ensure that those facilitated by charities, local governments, and communities across the UK are involved in our project to inform research, policy, and practice. Using Online Surveys, we conducted an online survey of identified organizations and departments to capture the geolocation and aims of projects and address project research questions. To our knowledge, this is the first survey of its kind and will provide valuable evidence of the role of the natural environment as a resource for migrant integration. The survey allowed us to identify nature-based initiatives from different sectors (e.g., migrant, environmental) and relevant departments of local governments that have undertaken nature-based integration projects in the UK. We collected over 100 survey responses to ensure a representative data set. Below, we provide a list of nature-based initiatives in the UK.
